Course Description

6th Grade General Music is an Allied Arts course at Marie Murphy School that meets daily during either 6th or 7th period. In this course, students will focus on learning about music from countries around the world. Students will also learn about music notation, composition, world drumming, and guitar.

Class Expectations

- Students are expected to be respectful—to each other, to the teacher, and to the materials and technology that we use in the music classroom.
- Students are expected to be responsible. Students should arrive in class with all of the required materials. Tardiness disrupts learning for the entire class. Repeated tardiness may result in disciplinary action. Students who are late for legitimate reasons should come to class with a signed pass.
- No food or drink other than bottled water (with a lid) are permitted in the music room. Furthermore, all bottled water should be kept on the floor and away from laptops and iMacs.

Grading

Just as in any class, students earn their grade in general music. Students' grades are broken down into the following categories and weights:

1.) Participation (20%): Students will receive a weekly participation grade based on the rubric below.

2.) Class Work (30%): Students will earn points on a variety of assignments/tasks completed in class and at home.

3.) Projects/Assessments (50%): Projects will be scored using rubrics which are unique to each task. Quizzes/performance assessments will be scored based on the nature of the assessment.
